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The Gentiles And The Gentile

The word gentile is found throughout the Bible, used most often in the New Testament. The Greek word most often translated to gentile is ἔθνος. This word means nations or people. In the Bible, when this word is used, it is not describing one nation or ethnic group, rather the term gentile refers to anyone who is not of Jewish descent.

What is a Gentile and Who Were They in the Bible?

Generally, when we see the word Gentile we should think about non-Jews because in the Greek the word Gentiles is "ethnos" or nations. To be a Gentile is to be someone who is not Jewish. When the word Gentile appears in the Old Testament it is from the Hebrew word "goy" which means the same thing as the Greek word does; nation or nations, depending upon whether the singular or plural is being used.

Gentile is a term that usually means 'someone who is not a Jew'. Other groups that claim Israelite heritage sometimes use the term to describe outsiders. The term is used by English translators for the Hebrew יוג and ירכנ in the Hebrew Bible and the Greek word ἔθνη in the New Testament. The word gentile is derived from Latin and not itself an original Hebrew or Greek word found in the Bible. The original words goy and ethnos refer to "peoples" or "nations" and are applied ...

"Gentiles means nations," according to Smith's Bible Dictionary. The term Gentile doesn't really describe who someone is, but rather who they are not - a Jew. A Gentile is one belonging to any nation or people group other than the Jewish people group.

The Gentiles referred to the non-Jewish people. Their "time" means that Gentiles rule over the world, including having dominion over the Jewish people. When did the Gentiles begin to rule Jerusalem? This started when the Jewish temple was destroyed in 586 BC by the Babylonians. Jewish rule ended and Gentile rule began.

When is the 'times of the Gentiles'?

gentiles jen'-tilz (goy, plural goyim; ethnos, "people," "nation"): Goy (or Goi) is rendered "Gentiles" in the King James Version in some 30 passages, but much more frequently "heathen," and oftener still, "nation," which latter is the usual rendering in the Revised Version (British and American), but it, is commonly used for a non-Israelitish people, and thus corresponds to the meaning of Gentiles."

Throughout the Bible the term "Gentiles" is used to describe a people, but who are those people? Some speculate that the word refers to all non Israelites, some believe it refers to the nations, and some believe it refers to Europeans (line of Japheth).

The Lord specifically chose Paul to be the apostle to the Gentiles to show that salvation is offered to all people. Ephesians 3:6 speaks of how Christ brings together both Gentile and Jew: "And this is God's plan: Both Gentiles and Jews who believe the Good News share equally in the riches inherited by God's children.

Why was Paul called the apostle to the Gentiles ...

We are now living in "the times of the Gentiles," that is, in the era of Gentile domination. When we examine the book of Revelation, we find similar references to the time of Gentile dominion ending with the return of Christ. In Revelation 11:2, John indicates that Jerusalem will be under Gentile rule, even though the temple has been restored.

In modern usage, "Gentile" applies to a single individual, although occasionally (as in English translations of the Bible) "the Gentiles" means "the nations." In postbiblical Hebrew, goy came to mean an individual non-Jew rather than a nation.

When the two concepts, "the times of the Gentiles" and "the fullness of the Gentiles" are compared, it becomes evident that the times of the Gentiles is primarily a political term and has to do with the political overlordship of Jerusalem.

Mr. Welch's view is that the "times of the Gentiles" is one of "Gentile dominion". But Luke 21:24 in which we read of the "times of the Gentiles" does not speak of dominion, as such. It reads, "and Jerusalem will be trodden down of the Gentiles until the times of the Gentiles be fulfilled".

Certainly Yahweh was not telling her, you are an adulteress, pregnant with two Gentile children, when your husband is not a Gentile. Yahweh said, "Two nations are in thy womb", and that is the way it is translated. It is the same word goyim, which elsewhere they generally translate as Gentiles.
